The present volume deals with early Christian and Patristic authors commenting on the various images and motifs of violence in the Book of Revelation and examines their reception at a large scale.

The Apocalypse of John belongs to the most puzzling texts of the New Testament. This book offers the proceedings of a conference that focused on how early Christian and Patristic authors have coped with all these many passages that deal with various sorts of violence. The volume contains essays on most of the important commentators and their reception history. It also deals with issues of method in reading the Book of Revelation, with important themes, the Jewish background of some of these motifs, and the reception of Patristic thought.
